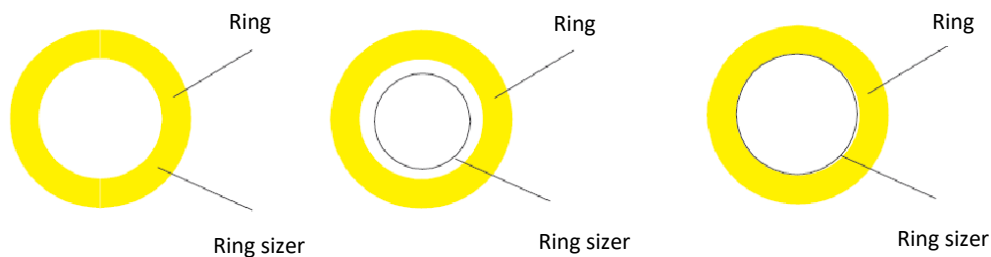


Choose the size of your ring with a virtual ring sizer

How to use the virtual ring sizer:

- Print this ring sizer and check with a ruler that the indicator is at the correct size and really measures 10cm on your sheet of paper. **Before printing, also ensure in your print settings that the scaling of the paper is settled on « None ».**
- Put down a ring that fits the best on your finger on the different circles below to know the size of your finger.
- Move your ring until you find its corresponding internal diameter. When the internal diameter of your ring exactly matches the internal diameter of a circle, you have found the size of the finger that suits you.
- For wide rings, we advise you to choose 1-2 size(s) bigger than the one that usually suits you the best. Wider Rings are more difficult to put on the fingers because they are wider and they tend to pass more difficultly at the level of the central phalanx.
- Moreover, fingers tend to swell or to retract depending on the temperature changes. When it's warm (spring and summer), fingers swell. This is why it would be better to choose 1-2 size(s) bigger(s) than the one that usually suits you. When it's cold (autumn and winter), fingers retract. It would be therefore better to opt for 1-2 size(s) smaller than the one that usually suits you.



You can't see the ring sizer anymore. You must look for a smaller size.

The ring sizer is smaller than your ring. You must look for a bigger size.

The ring sizer perfectly matches the diameter of your ring. You have made the right choice

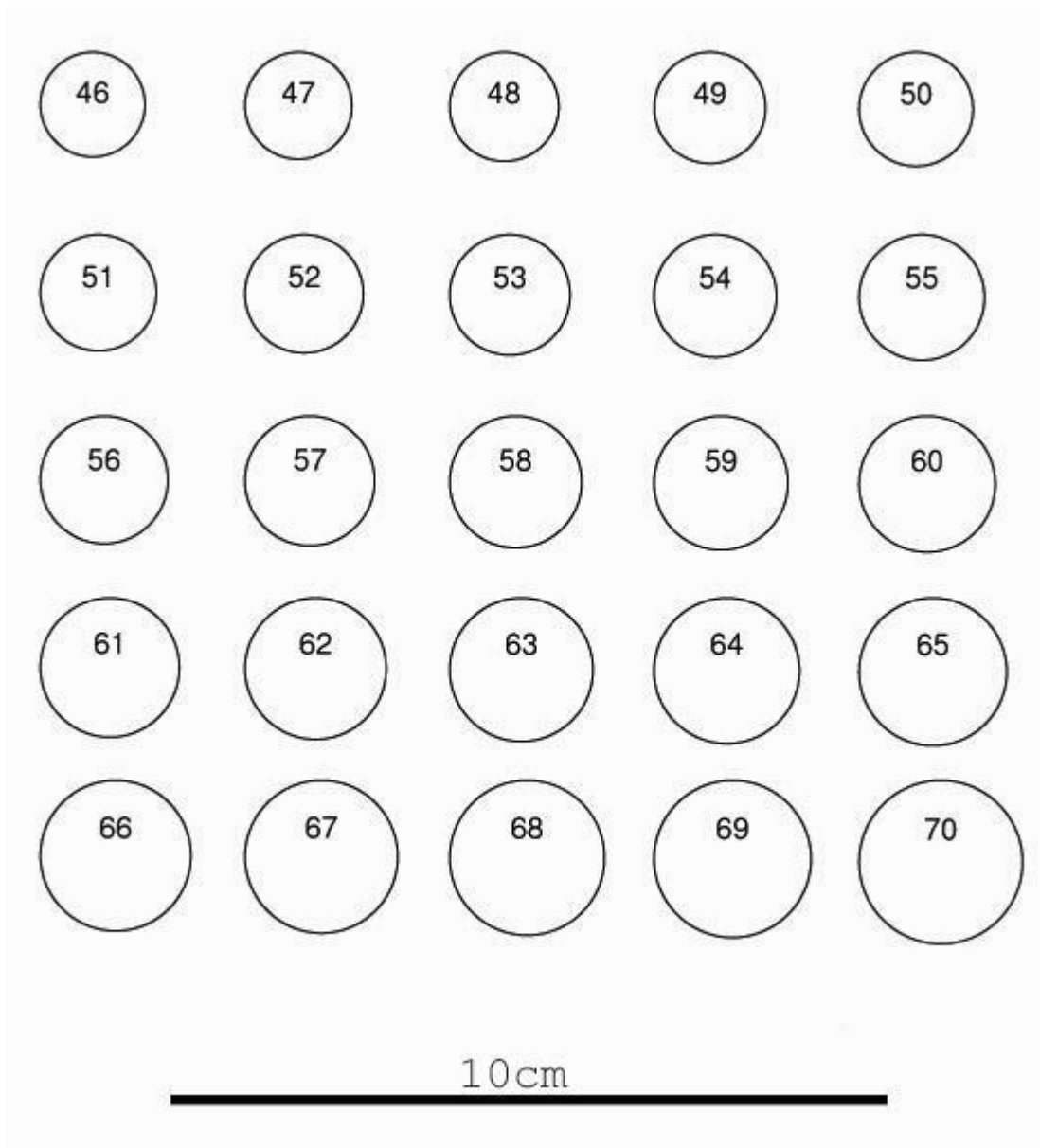
